WHEREAS, the Board finds that it should adopt specific practices and procedures in dealing with the proposals submitted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the following practices and procedures, shall apply to any proposal submitted to the Audubon County Board of Supervisors for the creation of an agricultural area within the County pursuant to Iowa Code Chapter 352.

- 1. An owner of farmland may submit a proposal to the Audubon County Board of Supervisors for the creation or expansion of an agricultural area within the County by filing with the Chairperson of the Board or the Audubon County Auditor a petition for the creation of an agricultural area on the form which is attached hereto and incorporated by this reference. A copy of the form may be obtained free of charge from the Audubon County Auditor during business hours.
- 2. The petition must be filled out in it entirely and the signatures of all owners of the land must be notarized. The Audubon County Auditor shall provide notary service on such petitions at the Auditor's Office.
- 3. The owner of the farmland must pay to the Audubon County Auditor the cost of publication of the proposal and the recording of the document. The cost of publication must be paid prior to the hearing set pursuant to Iowa Code Section 352.7, and the cost of recording the document must be paid prior to the filing pursuant to Section 352.8 of the Code.
 - 4. The Board of Supervisors shall act upon the proposal as provided for by law.
- 5. The Board of Supervisors may request the assistance of county employees or officials in obtaining information or performing an investigation concerning the proposal.
- 6. The Board of Supervisors shall provide notice of the proposal as provided for in Iowa Code Section 352.7, and may provide additional notice to the public concerning the proposal.
- 7. A public hearing held pursuant to Iowa Code Section 352.7 shall be conducted in a manner that provides a reasonable opportunity for all interested persons to provide opinion and information to the Board prior to the Board's decision.

 - (a) "Issuer" and "County" shall mean Audubon County, State of Iowa;

- (g) "Project Fund" shall mean the fund required to be established by this Resolution for the deposit of the proceeds of the Notes;

- (h) "Rebate Fund" shall mean the fund so defined in and established pursuant to the Tax Exemption Certificate;
- (I) "Registrar" shall be Bankers Trust Company of Des Moines, Iowa, or such successor as may be approved by Issuer as provided herein and who shall carry out the duties prescribed herein with respect to maintaining a register of the owners of the Notes. Unless otherwise specified, the Registrar shall also act as Transfer Agent for the Notes;
- (j) "Tax Exemption Certificate" shall mean the Tax Exemption Certificate executed by the Treasurer and delivered at the time of issuance and delivery of the Notes; and
- (k) "Treasurer" shall mean the County Treasurer or such other officer as shall succeed to the same duties and responsibilities with respect to the recording and payment of the Notes issued hereunder.
- Section 2. <u>Loan Agreement</u>. The form of Loan Agreement in substantially the form attached to this Resolution is hereby approved and is authorized to be executed and issued on behalf of the Issuer by the Chairperson and attested by the County Auditor.

Section 3. Levy and Certification of Annual Tax; Other Funds to be Used.

(a) <u>Levy of Annual Tax.</u> That for the purpose of providing funds to pay the principal and interest of the Notes hereinafter authorized to be issued, there is hereby levied for each future year the following direct annual tax on all the taxable property in Audubon, Iowa, to-wit:

- (b) Additional County Funds Available. Principal and interest coming due at anytime when the proceeds of said tax on hand shall be insufficient to pay the same shall be promptly paid when due from current funds of the County available for that purpose and reimbursement shall be made from such special fund in the amounts thus advanced.
- Section 4. Note Fund. Said tax shall be assessed and collected each year at the same time and in the same manner as, and in addition to, all other taxes in and for the County, and when collected they shall be converted into a special fund within the Debt Service Fund to be known as the "GENERAL OBLIGATION CAPITAL LOAN NOTE FUND 1995 NO. ONE" (the "Note Fund"), which is hereby pledged for and shall be used only for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Notes hereinafter authorized to be issued; and also there shall be apportioned to said fund its proportion of taxes received by the County from railway, express, telephone and telegraph Department of Revenue.

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Section 5. <u>Application of Note Proceeds.</u> Proceeds of the Notes other than accrued interest except as may be provided below shall be credited to the Project Fund and expended only for the purposes of the Project. Any amounts on hand in the Project Fund shall be available for the payment of the principal of or interest on the Notes at any time that other funds shall be insufficient to the purpose, in which event such funds shall be repaid to the Project Fund at the earliest opportunity. Any balance on hand in the Project Fund and not immediately required for its purposes may be invested not inconsistent with limitations provided by law or this Resolution. Accrued interest, if any, shall be deposited in the Note Fund.

Section 6. <u>Investments of Note Fund Proceeds.</u> All moneys held in the Note Fund and the Project Fund, shall be invested in investments permitted by Chapter 12B, Code of Iowa, 1993 (formerly Chapter 452, Code of Iowa, as amended) or deposited in financial institutions which are members of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation and the deposits in which are insured thereby and all such deposits exceeding the maximum amount insured from time to time by FDIC or its equivalent successor in any one financial institution shall be continuously secured by a valid pledge of direct obligations of the United State Government having an equivalent market value. All such interim investments shall mature before the date on which the moneys are required for payment of principal of or interest on the Notes as herein provided.

Section 7. Note Details, Execution and Redemption.

(a) Note Details. General Obligation Capital Loan Notes, Series 1995, of the County in the total amount of \$300,000, shall be issued to evidence the obligations of the Issuer under the Loan Agreement pursuant to the provisions of Sections 331.402 and 331.402 and 384.25 of the Code of Iowa, as amended, for the aforesaid purpose. The Notes shall be issued in one or more series and shall be on a parity and secured equally and ratably from the sources provided in Section 3 of this Resolution. The Notes shall be designated "GENERAL OBLIGATION CAPITAL LOAN NOTE, SERIES 1995 NO. ONE", be dated April 1, 1995, and bear interest from the date thereof, until payment thereof, at the office of the Paying Agent, said interest payable on December 1, 1995, and semiannually thereafter on the 1st day of June and December in each year until maturity at the rates hereinafter provided.

The Notes shall be executed by the facsimile signature of the Chairperson and attested by the facsimile signature of the County Auditor, and printed with the seal of the County and shall be fully registered as to both principal and interest as provided in this Resolution. Principal, interest and premium, if any, shall be payable at the office of the Paying Agent by mailing of a check to the registered owner of the Note. The Notes shall be in the denomination of \$5,000 or multiples thereof and shall mature and bear interest as follows:

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(b) <u>Redemption.</u> Notes maturing after June 1, 2002 may be called for redemption by the Issuer and paid before maturity on said date or any interest payment date thereafter, from any funds regardless of source, in whole or from time to time in part, in any order of maturity and within an annual maturity by lot. The terms redemption shall be par, plus accrued interest to date of call.

Prior to the redemption of any Notes under the provisions of the Resolution, the Registrar shall give notice by certified mail not less than thirty (30) days nor more than forty-five (45) days prior to the redemption date to each registered owner thereof.

On the date so designated for redemption, notice having been given in the manner and in the conditions herein above provided and monies for the payment of the redemption price being held in the Sinking Fund by the Registrar in trust for the bondholders, all as provided in the resolution. The note so called for redemption shall become and be due and payable at the redemption price provided for redemption of such Notes on such date. Interest on the Note so called for redemption shall cease to accrue; such Note shall cease to be entitled to any benefit hereunder, and the bondholder shall have no rights in respect thereof except to receive payment of the redemption price thereof.

Notes which have been called for redemption, with respect to which irrevocable instructions to call for redemption at a stated redemption have been given to the registrar, and monies for the payment of the face amount thereof, premium, if any, and interest on are held in separate accounts by the registrar in trust for bondholders shall not thereafter be deemed to be outstanding under the provisions of the resolution, other than be entitled to receive payment from such sources.

If selection by lot within a maturity is required, the Registrar shall by random selection of the names of the registered owners of the entire annual maturity select the Notes to be redeemed until the total amount of Notes to be called has been reached.

Section 8. Registration of Notes; Appointment of Registrar; Transfer; Ownership; Delivery; and Cancellation.

- (a) <u>Registration.</u> The ownership of Notes may be transferred only by the making of an entry upon the books kept for the registration and transfer of ownership of the Notes, and in no other way. Bankers Trust Company is hereby appointed as Registrar under the terms of this Resolution and under the provisions of a separate agreement with the Issuer filed herewith which is made a part hereof by this reference. Registrar shall maintain the books of the Issuer for the registration of ownership of the Notes for the payment of principal of and interest on the Notes as provided in this Resolution. All Notes shall be negotiable as provided in Article 8 of the Uniform Commercial Code subject to the provisions for registration and transfer contained in the Notes and in this Resolution.
- (b) <u>Transfer.</u> The ownership of any Note may be transferred only upon the Registration Books kept for the registration and transfer of Notes and only upon surrender thereof at the office of the Registrar together with an assignment duly executed by the holder or his duly authorized attorney in fact in such form as shall be satisfactory to the Registrar, along with the address and social security number or federal employer identification number of such transferee (or, if registration is to be made in the name of multiple individuals, of all such transferees). In the event that the address of the registered owner of a Note (other than a registered owner which is the nominee of the broker or dealer in question) is that of a broker or dealer, there must be disclosed on the Registration Books the information pertaining to the registered owner required above. Upon the transfer of any such Note, a new fully registered Note, of any denomination or denominations permitted by this Resolution in aggregate principal amount equal to the

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unmatured and unredeemed principal amount of such transferred fully registered Note, and bearing interest at the same rate and maturing on the same date or dates shall be delivered by the Registrar.

- (c) <u>Registration of Transferred Notes.</u> In all cases of the transfer of the Notes, the Registrar shall register, at the earliest practicable time, on the Registration Books, the Notes, in accordance with the provisions of this Resolution.
- (d) Ownership. As to any Note, the person in whose name the ownership of the same shall be registered on the Registration Books of the Registrar shall be deemed and regarded as the absolute owner thereof for all purposes, and payment of or on account of the principal of any such Notes and the premium, if any, and interest thereon shall be made only to or upon the order of the registered owner thereof or his legal representative. All such payments shall be valid and effectual to satisfy and discharge the liability upon such Note, including the interest thereon, to the extent of the sum or sums so paid.
- (e) <u>Cancellation.</u> All Notes which have been redeemed shall not be reissued but shall be canceled by the Registrar. All Notes which are cancelled by the Registrar shall be destroyed and a certificate of the destruction thereof shall be furnished promptly to the Issuer; provided that if the Issuer shall so direct, the Registrar shall forward the cancelled Notes to the Issuer.
- (f) Non-Presentment of Notes. In the event any payment check representing payment of principal of or interest on the Notes is returned to the Paying Agent or if any note is not presented for payment of principal at the maturity or redemption date, if funds sufficient to pay such principal of or interest on Notes shall have been made available to the Paying Agent for the benefit of the owner thereof, all liability of the Issuer to the owner thereof for such interest or payment of such Notes shall forthwith cease, terminate and be completely discharged, and thereupon it shall be the duty of the Paying Agent to hold such funds, without liability for interests thereon, for the benefit of the owner of such Notes who shall thereafter be restricted exclusively to such funds for any claim of whatever nature on his part under this Resolution or on, or with respect to, such interest or Notes. The Paying Agent's obligation to hold such funds shall continue for a period equal to two years and six months following the date on which such interest or principal became due, whether at maturity, or at the date fixed for redemption thereof, or otherwise, at which time the Paying Agent, shall surrender any remaining funds so held to the Issuer, whereupon any claim under this Resolution by the Owners of such interest or Notes of whatever nature shall be made upon the Issuer.
- (g) <u>Registration and Transfer Fees.</u> The Registrar may furnish to each owner, at the Issuer's expense, one note for each annual maturity. The Registrar shall furnish additional Notes in lesser denominations (but not less than the minimum denomination) to an owner who so requests.
- Section 9. Reissuance of Mutilated, Destroyed, Stolen or Lost Notes. In case any outstanding Note shall become mutilated or be destroyed, stolen or lost, the Issuer shall at the request of Registrar authenticate and deliver a new Note of like tenor and amount as the Note so mutilated, destroyed, stolen or lost, in exchange and substitution for such mutilated Note to Registrar, upon surrender of such mutilated Note, or in lieu of and substitution for the Note destroyed, stolen or lost, upon filing with the Registrar evidence satisfactory to the Registrar and Issuer that such Note has been destroyed, stolen or lost and proof of ownership thereof, and upon furnishing the Registrar and Issuer with satisfactory indemnity and complying with such other reasonable regulations as the Issuer or its agent may prescribe and paying such expenses as the Issuer may incur in connection therewith.

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Section 10. <u>Record Date.</u> Payments of principal and interest, otherwise than upon full redemption, made in respect of any Note, shall be made to the registered holder thereof or to their designated Agent as the same appear on the books of the Registrar on the 15th day of the month preceding the payment date. All such payments shall fully discharge the obligations of the Issuer in respect of such Notes to the extent of the payments so made. Payments of principal shall only be made upon surrender of the Note to the Paying Agent.

Section 11. Execution, Authentication and Delivery of the Notes. The Chairperson and Auditor shall execute and deliver the Notes to the Registrar, who shall authenticate the Notes and deliver the same to or upon order of the Purchaser. No Note shall be valid or obligatory for any purpose or shall be entitled to any right or benefit hereunder unless the Registrar shall duly endorse and execute on such Note a Certificate of Authentication substantially in the form of the Certificate herein set forth. Such Certificate upon any Note executed on behalf of the Issuer shall be conclusive evidence that the Note so authenticated has been duly issued under this Resolution and that the holder thereof is entitled to the benefits of this Resolution.

No Notes shall be authenticated and delivered by the Registrar, unless and until there shall have been provided the following:

- 1. A certified copy of the resolution of Issuer approving the execution of a Loan Agreement and a copy of the Loan Agreement.
- 2. A written order of Issuer signed by the County Treasurer directing the authentication and delivery of the Notes to or upon the order of the Purchaser upon payment of the purchase price as set forth therein;
- 3. The approving opinion of Ahlers, Cooney, Dorweiler, Haynie, Smith and Allbee, P.C., Bond Counsel, concerning the validity and legality of all the Notes proposed to be issued.

Section 12. <u>Right to Name Substitute Paying Agent or Registrar</u>. Issuer reserves the right to name a substitute, successor Registrar or Paying Agent upon giving prompt written notice to each registered noteholder.

Section 13. <u>Form of Note.</u> Notes shall be printed in substantial compliance with standards proposed by the American Standards Institute substantially in the form as follows:



WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Audubon County Memorial Hospital (the "Hospital") has heretofore determined to construct and furnish an inpatient addition to the Hospital (the "Project) and has requested Audubon County (the "County") to call a special election to vote on the question of issuing \$2,400,000 General Obligation County Hospital Bonds (the "Bonds") to provide funds to pay the cost, to that amount, of the Project, at which election the proposition was adopted by a vote in favor equal to at least 60% of the total votes cast for and against the proposition; and

WHEREAS, the County and the Hospital desire to proceed with the public sale and issuance of the Bonds, and it is necessary at this time to provide for the advertisement of such sale;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Audubon County, Iowa, as follows:

Sealed bids for the purchase of the Bonds will be received and canvassed on behalf of the County at 11:00 o'clock a.m. on October 26, 1995, at the Audubon County Courthouse, Audubon, Iowa, and the Board shall meet at 12:00 o'clock Noon on the same date at the Audubon County Courthouse, Audubon, Iowa, for the purpose of considering such bids received and considering and passing a resolution providing for the sale and issuance of the Bonds.

Section 2. The County Auditor is authorized and directed to publish notice of said sale, as provided by Chapter 75 of the Code of Iowa, in substantially the following form:

No open bids will be accepted.

RESOLUTION NO. 95-8

Providing for the award and issuance of \$2,400,000 General Obligation Hospital Bonds and providing for the levy of taxes to pay the same

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of Audubon County, Iowa (the "County") has called a special County election to vote on the question of issuing \$2,400,000 General Obligation Hospital Bonds (the "Bonds") to provide funds to pay the cost, to that extent, of constructing and furnishing an inpatient addition to the Audubon County Memorial Hospital (the "Hospital"), at which election the proposition was adopted by a vote in favor equal to at least 60% of the total votes cast for and against the proposition and the County may now proceed with the issuance of the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, Notice of Sale of the Bonds was heretofore given in strict compliance with the provisions of Chapter 75 of the Code of Iowa; and

WHEREAS, sealed bids for the purchase of the Bonds were received and canvassed on behalf of the County at the time and place fixed therefor in the published Notice of Sale and the substance of such sealed bids noted in the minutes; and

WHEREAS, upon final consideration of all bids by the Board, the bid of <u>Harris Trust and Savings Bank, Chicago, Illinois</u>, is the best, such bid proposing the lowest interest cost to the County;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Audubon County, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. The bid referred to in the preamble hereof is hereby accepted, and the Bonds, maturing on June 1 in each of the years, in the respective principal amounts and bearing interest at the respective rates, as follows:

are hereby awarded and authorized to be issued to the said bidder at the price specified in such bid, together with accrued interest.

Section 2. The form of agreement of sale of the Bonds is hereby approved, and the Chairperson and County Auditor are hereby authorized to accept and execute the same for and on behalf of the County and to affix the County seal thereto.

Section 3. The Bonds shall be in the denomination of \$5,000 each, or any integral multiple thereof, shall be dated December 1, 1995, and shall become due and payable and bear interest as set forth in Section 1 hereof.

Bankers Trust Company, Des Moines, Iowa, is hereby designated as the Bond Registrar and Paying Agent for the Bonds and may be hereinafter referred to as the "Bond Registrar" or the "Paying Agent".

The County reserves the right to call and redeem part or all of the Bonds maturing in each of the years 2006 to 2008, inclusive, prior to and in any order of maturity on June 1, 2005, or on any interest payment date thereafter upon terms of par and accrued interest. If less than all of the Bonds of any like maturity are to be redeemed, the particular part of those Bonds to be redeemed shall be selected by the Bond Registrar by lot. The Bonds may be called in part in one or more units of \$5,000. If less than the entire principal amount of any Bond in a denomination of more than \$5,000 is to be redeemed, the Bond Registrar will issue and deliver to the registered owner thereof, upon surrender of such original Bond, a new Bond or Bonds, in any authorized denomination, in a total aggregate principal amount equal to the unredeemed balance of the original Bond. Notice of such redemption as aforesaid identifying the Bond or Bonds (or portion thereof) to be redeemed shall be mailed by certified mail to the registered owners thereof at the addresses shown on the County's registration books not less than 30 nor more than 60 days prior to such redemption date. All of such Bonds as to which the County reserves and exercises the right of redemption and as to which notice as aforesaid shall have been given

and for the redemption of which funds are duly provided, shall cease to bear interest on the redemption date.

All of the interest on the Bonds shall be payable December 1, 1996, and semiannually thereafter on the first day of June and December in each year. Interest shall be calculated on the basis of a 360-day year comprised of twelve 30-day months. Payment of interest on the Bonds shall be made to the registered owners appearing on the bond registration books of the County at the close of business on the fifteenth day of the month next preceding the interest payment date and shall be paid by check or draft mailed to the registered owners at the addresses shown on such registration books. Principal of the Bonds shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America to the registered owners or their legal representatives upon presentation and surrender of the Bond or Bonds at the office of the Paying Agent.

The County hereby pledges the faith, credit, revenues and resources and all of the real and personal property of the County for the full and prompt payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds.

The Bonds shall be executed on behalf of the County with the official manual or facsimile signature of the Chairperson and attested with the official manual or facsimile signature of the County Auditor and shall have the County's seal impressed or printed thereon, and shall be fully registered bonds without interest coupons. In case any officer whose signature or the facsimile of whose signature appears on the Bonds shall cease to be such officer before the delivery of the Bonds, such signature or such facsimile signature shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes, the same as if such officer had remained in office until delivery.

The Bonds shall be fully registered as to principal and interest in the names of the owners on the registration books of the County kept by the Bond Registrar, and after such registration payment of the principal thereof and interest thereon shall be made to the registered owners, their legal representatives or assigns. Each Bond shall be transferable only upon the registration books of the County upon presentation to the Bond Registrar, together with either a written instrument of transfer satisfactory to the Bond Registrar or the assignment form thereon completed and duly executed by the registered owner or the duly authorized attorney for such registered owner.

The record and identity of the owners of the Bonds shall be kept confidential as provided by Section 22.7 of the Code of Iowa.

The Bonds shall not be valid or become obligatory for any purpose until the Certificate of Authentication thereon shall have been signed by the Bond Registrar.

Notwithstanding anything above to the contrary, the Bonds shall be issued initially as Depository Bonds, with one fully registered Bond for each maturity date, in principal amounts equal to the amount of principal maturing on each such date, and registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee for The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York ("DTC"). On original issue, the Bonds shall be deposited with DTC for the purpose of maintaining a book-entry system for recording the ownership interests of its participants and the transfer of those interests among its participants (the "Participants"). In the event that DTC determines not to continue to act as securities depository for the Bonds or the County determines not to continue the book-entry system for recording ownership interests in the Bonds with DTC, the County will discontinue the book-entry system with DTC. If the County does not select another qualified securities depository to replace DTC (or a successor depository) in order to continue a book-entry system, the County will register and deliver replacement bonds in the form of fully registered certificates, in authorized denominations of \$5,000 or integral multiples of \$5,000, in accordance with instructions from Cede & Co., as nominee for DTC. In the event that the County identifies a qualified securities depository to replace DTC, the County will register and deliver replacement bonds, fully registered in the name of such depository, or its nominee, in the denominations as set forth above, as reduced from time to time prior to maturity in connection with redemptions or retirements by call or payment, and in such event, such depository will then maintain the book-entry system for recording ownership interests in the Bonds.

Ownership interest in the Bonds may be purchased by or through Participants. Such Participants and the persons for whom they acquire interest in the Bonds as nominees will not receive certificated Bonds, but each such Participant will receive a credit balance in the records of DTC in the amount of such Participant's interest in the Bonds, which will be confirmed in accordance with DTC's standard procedures. Each such person for which a Participant has an interest in the Bonds, as nominee, may desire to make arrangements with such Participant to have all notices of redemption or other communications of the County to DTC, which may affect such person, forwarded in writing by such Participant and to have notification made of all interest payments.

The County will have no responsibility or obligation to such Participants or the persons for whom they act as nominees with respect to payment to or providing of notice for such Participants or the persons for which they act as nominees.

As used herein, the term "Beneficial Owner" shall hereinafter be deemed to include the person for whom the Participant acquires an interest in the Bonds.

DTC will receive payments from the County, to be remitted by DTC to the Participants for subsequent disbursement to the Beneficial Owners. The ownership interest of each Beneficial Owner in the Bonds will be recorded on the records of the

Participants whose ownership interest will be recorded on a computerized book-entry system kept by DTC.

When reference is made to any action which is required or permitted to be taken by the Beneficial Owners, such reference shall only relate to those permitted to act (by statute, regulation or otherwise) on behalf of such Beneficial Owners for such purposes when notices are given they shall be sent by the County to DTC. DTC shall forward (or cause to be forwarded) the notices to the Participants so that the Participants can forward the same to the Beneficial Owners.

Beneficial Owners will receive written confirmations of their purchases from the Participants acting on behalf of the Beneficial Owners detailing the terms of the Bonds acquired. Transfers of ownership interest in the Bonds will be accomplished by book entries made by DTC and the Participants who act on behalf of the Beneficial Owners. Beneficial Owners will not receive certificates representing their ownership interest in the Bonds, except as specifically provided herein. Interest and principal will be paid when due by the County to DTC, then paid by DTC to the Participants and thereafter paid by the Participants to the Beneficial Owners.

When annually entering such taxes for collection, the County Auditor shall include the same as a part of the tax levy for Debt Service Fund purposes of the County and when collected, the proceeds of the taxes shall be converted into the Debt Service Fund of the County and set aside therein as a special account to be used solely and only for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds hereby authorized and for no other purpose whatsoever. Any amount received by the County as accrued interest on the Bonds shall be deposited into such special account and used to pay interest due on the Bonds on the first interest payment date.

Section 8. The interest or principal and both of them falling due in any year or years shall, if necessary, be paid promptly from current funds on hand in advance of taxes levied and when the taxes shall have been collected, reimbursement shall be made to such current funds in the sum thus advanced.

Section 9. It is the intention of the County that interest on the Bonds be and remain excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes pursuant to the appropriate provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the Treasury Regulations in effect with respect thereto (all of the foregoing herein referred to as the "Internal Revenue Code"). In furtherance thereof, the County covenants to comply with the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code as they may from time to time be in effect or amended and further covenants to comply with the applicable future laws, regulations, published rulings and court decisions as may be necessary to insure that the interest on the Bonds will remain excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes. Section 10. <u>Continuing Disclosure</u>. The Securities and Exchange Commission (the "SEC") has promulgated amendments to Rule 15c2-12 under the Securities

Exchange Act of 1934 (17 C.F.R. § 240.15c2-12) (the "Rule") which govern the obligations of participating underwriters to require that issuers of municipal bonds enter into contracts for the benefit of the bondholders to provide continuing disclosure with respect to the bonds. This Board hereby finds, determines and declares that the Bonds are exempted entirely from the application of paragraph (b)(5) of the Rule by reason of the exemption granted in paragraph (d)(2) thereof and the fact that the offering of the Bonds commenced before January 1, 1996. Specifically, this Board hereby finds that the only "obligated person" (within the meaning of the Rule) with respect to the Bonds is the County and that, including the Bonds, there will be approximately \$2,837,345 (and, in any event, no more than \$10 million) in principal amount of municipal securities outstanding on the date of issuance of the Bonds as to which the County is an obligated person (excluding municipal securities exempt from the Rule under paragraph (d)(1) thereof because, among other things, they were issued in minimum denominations of \$100,000). In making such finding, the County hereby represents that it has not issued within the six months before the date of issuance of the Bonds and that it reasonably expects that it will not, issue within six months after the date of issuance of the Bonds, other securities of the County of substantially the same security and providing financing for the same general purpose or purposes as the Bonds.

Section 11. Exhibit A attached hereto containing the municipal bond insurance provisions is hereby incorporated as a part of this resolution as though fully set out herein.

Section 12. All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

EXHIBIT A MUNICIPAL BOND INSURANCE

DEFINITIONS

"AMBAC Indemnity" shall mean AMBAC Indemnity Corporation, a Wisconsin-domiciled stock insurance company.

"Municipal Bond Insurance Policy" shall mean the municipal bond insurance policy issued by AMBAC Indemnity insuring the payment when due of the principal of an interest on the Bonds as provided therein.

AMBAC CONSENT LANGUAGE

A. Consent of AMBAC Indemnity

Any provision of this Resolution expressly recognizing or granting rights in or to AMBAC Indemnity may not be amended in any manner which affects the rights of AMBAC Indemnity hereunder without the prior written consent of AMBAC Indemnity.

B. Consent of AMBAC Indemnity in Addition to Bondholder Consent

Unless otherwise provided in this Section, AMBAC Indemnity's consent shall be required in addition to Bondholder consent, when required, for the following purposes: (i) execution and delivery of any supplemental resolution or any amendment, supplement or change to or modification of this Resolution (ii) removal of the Trustee or Paying Agent and selection and appointment of any successor trustee or paying agent; and (iii) initiation or approval of any action not described in (i) or (ii) above which requires Bondholder consent.

C. Consent of AMBAC Indemnity in the Event of Insolvency

Any reorganization or liquidation plan with respect to the Issuer must be acceptable to AMBAC Indemnity. In the event of any reorganization or liquidation, AMBAC Indemnity shall have the right to vote on behalf of all bondholders who hold AMBAC Indemnity-insured bonds absent a default by AMBAC Indemnity under the applicable Municipal Bond Insurance Policy insuring such Bonds.

D. Consent of AMBAC Indemnity Upon Default

Anything in this Resolution to the contrary notwithstanding, upon the occurrence and continuance of an event of default as defined herein, AMBAC Indemnity shall be entitled to control and direct the enforcement of all rights and remedies granted to the Bondholders or the Trustee for the benefit of the Bondholders under this Resolution.

INFORMATION TO BE GIVEN TO AMBAC

- A. While the Municipal Bond Insurance Policy is in effect, the Issuer or the Trustee shall furnish to AMBAC Indemnity (to the attention of the Surveillance Department, unless otherwise indicated):
- (a) as soon as practicable after the filing thereof, a copy of any financial statement of the Issuer and a copy of any audit and annual report of the Issuer;
- (b) a copy of any notice to be given to the registered owners of the Bonds, including, without limitation, notice of any redemption of or defeasance of Bonds, and any certificate rendered pursuant to this Resolution relating to the security for the Bonds; and
 - (c) such additional information it may reasonably request.
- B. The Trustee or Issuer shall notify AMBAC Indemnity of any failure of the Issuer to provide relevant notices, certificates, etc.
- C. The Issuer will permit AMBAC Indemnity to discuss the affairs, finances and accounts of the Issuer or any information AMBAC Indemnity may reasonably request regarding the security for the Bonds with appropriate officers of the Issuer. The Trustee or Issuer will permit AMBAC Indemnity to have access to the Project and have access to and to make copies of all books and records relating to the Bonds at any reasonable time.
- D. AMBAC Indemnity shall have the right to direct an accounting at the Issuer's expense, and the Issuers failure to comply with such direction within thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice of the direction from AMBAC Indemnity shall be deemed a default hereunder; provided, however, that if compliance cannot occur within such period, then such period will be extended so long as compliance is begun within such period and diligently pursued, but only if such extension would not materially adversely affect the interests of any registered owner of the Bonds.
- E. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Resolution, the Trustee or Issuer shall immediately notify AMBAC Indemnity if at any time there are insufficient moneys to make any payments of principal and/or interest as required and immediately upon the occurrence of any event of default hereunder.
- F. To the extent that the Issuer has entered into a continuing disclosure agreement with respect to the Bonds, AMBAC Indemnity shall be included as party to be notified.

PERMITTED INVESTMENTS

(A) AMBAC Indemnity will allow the following obligations to be used as Permitted Investments for all purposes, including defeasance investments in refunding escrow accounts.

(AMBAC Indemnity does not give a premium credit for the investment of accrued and/or capitalized interest.)

- (1) Cash (insured at all times by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or otherwise collateralized with obligations described in paragraph (2) below), or
- (2) Direct obligations of (including obligations issued or held in book entry form on the books of) the Department of the Treasury of the United States of America.
- (B) AMBAC Indemnity will allow the following obligations to be used as Permitted Investments for all purposes other than: (i) defeasance investments in refunding escrow accounts.
 - (1) obligations of any of the following federal agencies which obligations represent full faith and credit of the United States of America, including:
 - Export Import Bank
 - Farm Credit System Financial Assistance Corporation
 - Farmers Home Administration
 - General Services Administration
 - U.S. Maritime Administration
 - Small Business Administration
 - Government National Mortgage Association (GNMA)
 - U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (PHA's)
 - Federal Housing Administration;
 - (2) <u>senior debt obligations</u> rated "AAA" by Standard & Poor's Corporation (S&P) and "Aaa" by Moody's Investor Service, Inc. (Moody's) issued by the Federal National Mortgage Association or the Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corporation. <u>Senior debt obligations of other government sponsored agencies approved by AMBAC Indemnity</u>;
 - (3) U.S. dollar denominated deposit accounts, federal funds and banker's acceptances with domestic commercial banks which have a rating on their short term certificates of deposit on the date of purchase of "A-1" or "A-1+" by S&P and "P-1" by Moody's and maturing no more than

360 days after the date of purchase. (Ratings on holding companies are not considered as the rating of the bank);

- (4) commercial paper which is rated at the time of purchase in the single highest classification, "A-1+" by S&P and "P-1" by Moody's and which matures not more than 270 days after the date of purchase;
- (5) investments in a money market fund rated "AAAm" or "AAAm-G" or better by S&P;
- (6) Pre-refunded Municipal Obligations defined as follows: Any bonds or other obligations of any state of the United States of America or of any agency, instrumentality or local governmental unit of any such state which are not callable at the option of the obligor prior to maturity or as to which irrevocable instructions have been given by the obligor to call on the date specified in the notice; and
 - (A) which are rated, based on the irrevocable escrow account or fund (the "escrow"), in the highest rating category of S&P and Moody's or any successors thereto; or
- (B) (i) which are fully secured as to principal and interest and redemption premium, if any, by an escrow consisting only of cash or obligations described in paragraph A(2) above, which escrow may be applied only to the payment of such principal of and interest and redemption premium, if any, on such bonds or other obligations on the maturity date or dates thereof or the specified redemption date or dates pursuant to such irrevocable instructions, as appropriate, and (ii) which escrow is sufficient, as verified by a nationally recognized independent certified public accountant, to pay principal of and interest and redemption premium, if any, on the bonds or other obligations described in this paragraph on the maturity date or dates specified in the irrevocable instructions referred to above, as appropriate;
 - (7) investment agreements approved in writing by AMBAC Indemnity Corporation with notice to S&P; and
 - (8) other forms of investments approved in writing by AMBAC Indemnity with notice to S&P.
- (C) The value of the above investments shall be determined as follows:

"Value", which shall be determined as of the end of each month, means that the value of any investments shall be calculated as follows:

(a) as to investments the bid and asked prices of which are published on a regular basis in The Wall Street Journal (or, if not there, then in The

New York Times): the average of the bid and asked prices for such investments so published on or most recently prior to such time of determination;

- (b) as to investments the bid and asked prices of which are not published on a regular basis in The Wall Street Journal or The New York Times: the average bid price at such time of determination for such investments by any two nationally recognized government securities dealers (selected by the Trustee in its absolute discretion) at the time making a market in such investments or the bid price published by a nationally recognized pricing service;
- (c) as to certificates of deposit and bankers acceptances: the face amount thereof, plus accrued interest; and
- (d) as to any investment not specified above: the value thereof established by prior agreement between the Issuer, the Trustee and AMBAC Indemnity Corporation.

DEFEASANCE LANGUAGE

- A. The definition of "Outstanding" bonds or obligations, or any like concept, should specifically include bonds obligations which fall into the category described below.
- B. The defeasance section of the Financing Document should include the following language:

Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, in the event that the principal and/or interest due on the Bonds shall be paid by AMBAC Indemnity Corporation pursuant to the Municipal Bond Insurance Policy, the Bonds shall remain Outstanding for all purposes, not be defeased or otherwise satisfied and not be considered paid by the Issuer, and the assignment and pledge of the Trust Estate and all covenants, agreements and other obligations of the Issuer to the registered owners shall continue to exist and shall run to the benefit of AMBAC Indemnity, and AMBAC Indemnity shall be subrogated to the right of such registered owners.

PAYMENT PROCEDURE PURSUANT THE MUNICIPAL BOND INSURANCE POLICY

As long as the bond insurance shall be in full force and effect, the Issuer, the Trustee and any Paying Agent, if any, agree to comply with the following provisions:

(a) At least one (1) day prior to all Interest Payment Dates the Trustee or Paying Agent, if any, will determine whether there will be sufficient funds in the Funds and Accounts to pay the principal of or interest on

the Bonds on such Interest Payment Date. If the Trustee or Paying Agent, if any, determines that there will be insufficient funds in the Funds and Accounts, the Trustee or Paying Agent, if any, shall so notify AMBAC Indemnity. Such notice shall specify the amount of the anticipated deficiency, the Bonds to which such deficiency is applicable and whether such Bonds will be deficient as to principal or interest, or both. If the Trustee or Paying Agent, if any, has not so notified AMBAC Indemnity at least one (1) day prior to an Interest Payment Date, AMBAC Indemnity will make payments of principal or interest due on the Bonds on or before the first (1st) day next following the date on which AMBAC Indemnity shall have received notice of nonpayment from the Trustee or Paying Agent, if any.

- (b) The Trustee or Paying Agent, if any, shall, after giving notice to AMBAC Indemnity as provided in (a) above, make available to AMBAC Indemnity and, at AMBAC Indemnity's direction, to the United States Trust Company of New York, as insurance trustee for AMBAC Indemnity or any successor insurance trustee (the Insurance Trustee), the registration books of the Issuer maintained by the Trustee or Paying Agent, if any, and all records relating to the Funds and Accounts maintained under this Resolution.
- (c) The Trustee or Paying Agent, if any, shall provide AMBAC Indemnity and the Insurance Trustee with a list of registered owners of Bonds entitled to receive principal or interest payments from AMBAC Indemnity under the terms of the Municipal Bond Insurance Policy, and shall make arrangements with the Insurance Trustee (i) to mail checks or drafts to the registered owners of Bonds entitled to receive full or partial interest payments from AMBAC Indemnity and (ii) to pay principal upon Bonds surrendered to the Insurance Trustee by the registered owners of Bonds entitled to receive full or partial principal payments from AMBAC Indemnity.
- (d) The Trustee or Paying Agent, if any, shall, at the time it provides notice to AMBAC Indemnity pursuant to (a) above, notify registered owners of Bonds entitled to receive the payment of principal or interest thereon from AMBAC Indemnity (i) as to the fact of such entitlement, (ii) that AMBAC Indemnity will remit to them all or a part of the interest payments next coming due upon proof of Bondholder entitlement to interest payments and delivery to the Insurance Trustee, in form satisfactory to the Insurance Trustee, of an appropriate assignment of the registered owner's right to payment, (iii) that should they be entitled to receive full payment of principal from AMBAC Indemnity, they must surrender their Bonds (along with an appropriate instrument of assignment in form satisfactory to the Insurance Trustee to permit ownership of such Bonds to be registered

in the name of AMBAC Indemnity) for payment to the Insurance Trustee, and not the Trustee or Paying Agent, if any, and (iv) that should they be entitled to receive partial payment of principal from AMBAC Indemnity, they must surrender their Bonds for payment thereon first to the Trustee or Paying Agent, if any, who shall note on such Bonds the portion of the principal paid by the Trustee or Paying Agent, if any, and then, along with an appropriate instrument of assignment in form satisfactory to the Insurance Trustee, to the Insurance Trustee, which will then pay the unpaid portion of principal.

- (e) In the event the Trustee or Paying Agent, if any, has notice that any payment of principal of or interest on a Bond which has become Due for Payment and which is made to a Bondholder by or on behalf of the Issuer has been deemed a preferential transfer and theretofore recovered from its registered owner pursuant to the United States Bankruptcy Code by a trustee in bankruptcy in accordance with the final, nonappealable order of a court having competent jurisdiction, the Trustee or Paying Agent, if any, shall, at the time AMBAC Indemnity is notified pursuant to (a) above, notify all registered owners that in the event that any registered owner's payment is so recovered, such registered owner will be entitled to payment from AMBAC Indemnity to the extent of such recovery if sufficient funds are not otherwise available, and the Trustee or Paying Agent, if any, shall furnish to AMBAC Indemnity its records evidencing the payments of principal of and interest on the Bonds which have been made by the Registrar and subsequently recovered from registered owners and the dates on which such payments were made.
- (f) In addition to those rights granted AMBAC Indemnity under this Resolution, AMBAC Indemnity shall, to the extent it makes payment of principal of or interest on Bonds, become subrogated to the rights of the recipients of such payments in accordance with the terms of the Municipal Bond Insurance Policy, and to evidence such subrogation (i) in the case of subrogation as to claims for past due interest, the Trustee or Paying Agent, if any, shall note AMBAC Indemnity's rights as subrogee on the registration books of the Issuer maintained by the Trustee or Paying Agent, if any, upon receipt from AMBAC Indemnity of proof of the payment of interest thereon to the registered owners of the Bonds, and (ii) in the case of subrogation as to claims for past due principal, the Trustee or Paying Agent, if any, shall note AMBAC Indemnity's rights as subrogee on the registration books of the Issuer maintained by the Trustee or Paying Agent, if any, upon surrender of the Bonds by the registered owners thereof together with proof of the payment of principal thereof.

TRUSTEE RELATED PROVISIONS

- 1. The Trustee (or Paying Agent) may be removed at any time, at the request of AMBAC Indemnity, for any breach of the Trust set forth herein.
- 2. AMBAC Indemnity shall receive prior written notice of any Trustee (or Paying Agent) resignation.
- 3. Every successor Trustee appointed pursuant to this Section shall be a trust company or bank in good standing located in or incorporated under the laws of the State, duly authorized to exercise trust powers and subject to examination by federal or state authority, having a reported capital and surplus of not less than \$75,000,000 and acceptable to AMBAC Indemnity. Any successor Paying Agent, if applicable, shall not be appointed unless AMBAC approves such successor in writing.
- 4. Notwithstanding any other provision of the Resolution, in determining whether the rights of the Bondholders will be adversely affected by any action taken pursuant to the terms and provisions of this Resolution, the Trustee (or Paying Agent) shall consider the effect on the Bondholders as if there were no Municipal Bond Insurance Policy.
- 5. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Resolution, no removal, resignation or termination of the Trustee (or Paying Agent) shall take effect until a successor, acceptable to AMBAC, shall be appointed.

INTERESTED PARTIES

A. AMBAC As Third Party Beneficiary

To the extent that this Resolution confers upon or give or grants to AMBAC any right, remedy or claim under or by reason of this Resolution, AMBAC is hereby explicitly recognized as being a third-party beneficiary hereunder and may enforce any such right remedy or claim conferred, given or granted hereunder.

B. Parties Interested Herein

Nothing in this Resolution expressed or implied is intended or shall be construed to confer upon, or to give or grant to, any person or entity, other than the Issuer, the Trustee, AMBAC Indemnity, the Paying Agent, if any, and the registered owners of the Bonds, any right, remedy or claim under or by reason of this Resolution or any covenant, condition or stipulation hereof, and all covenants, stipulations, promises and agreements in this Resolution contained by and on behalf of the Issuer shall be for the sole and exclusive benefit of the Issuer, the Trustee, AMBAC Indemnity, the Paying Agent, if any, and the registered owners of the Bonds.

 - d. an organization who employs, or is about to employ any of the above has a financial interest or other interest in the firm selected for award.
- 4. <u>Gratuities</u>: The Local Government's officers, employees, or agents shall neither solicit nor accept gratuities, favors, or anything of monetary value from contractors, potential contractors, or subcontractors

RESOLUTION ADOPTING A PROCUREMENT POLICY

WHEREAS: The County of Audubon, Iowa (to be henceforth referred to as the Local Government).

Procurement Policy

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that sound business judgment is utilized in all procurement transactions and that supplies, equipment, construction, and services are obtained efficiently and

economically and in compliance with applicable federal law and executive orders and to ensure that all procurement transactions will be conducted in a manner that provides full and open competition.

Application

This policy applies to the procurement of all supplies, equipment, construction, and services of and for the local government related to the implementation and administration of the Community Development Block Grant. All procurement will be done in accordance with 24 CFR; Part 85.

Policy

I. Methods of Procurement

Procurement under grants shall be made by one of the following methods, as described herein; (a)small purchase procedures; (b)sealed bids (formal advertising); (c)competitive proposals; (d)non-competitive proposals.

- A. Small purchase procedures are relatively simple and informal procurement methods that sound and appropriate for a procurement of services, supplies, or other property, costing in aggregate not more than \$25,000. If small purchase procedures are used for a procurement under a grant, price or rate quotations shall be obtained from an adequate number of qualified sources to determine the most advantageous provider.
- B. In sealed bids (formal advertising), sealed bids are publicly solicited and a firm fixed price contract (lump sum or unit price) is awarded to the responsible bidder whose bid conforming with all of the material terms and conditions of the invitation for bids, is lowest in price. The sealed bids methods is the preferred method for procuring construction.
 - 1. In order for formal advertising to be feasible, the following conditions must be present:
 - (a) A complete, adequate and realistic specification or purchase description;
 - (b)two or more responsible suppliers are willing and able to compete effectively for the business; and
 - (c)the procurement lends itself to a firm fixed price contract, and a selection of a successful bidder can appropriately be made principally on the basis of price.
 - 2. When the formal advertising is used for a procurement under a grant, the following requirements shall apply:
 - (a) The invitation for bids will be publicly advertised and bids shall be solicited from an adequate number of known suppliers.
 - (b) The invitation for bids, including specifications and pertinent attachments, shall clearly define the items or services needed in order for the bidders to properly respond to the invitation.
 - (c) All bids shall be opened publicly at the time and place stated in the invitation for bids.
 - (d)A firm fixed price contract award shall be made by written notice to that responsible bidder whose bid, conforming to the invitation for bids, is lowest. Where specified in the bidding documents, factors such as discounts, transportation costs and life cycle costs shall be considered in deterring which bid is lowest. Payment discounts may only be used to determine low bid when prior experience of the Local Government indicated that such discounts are generally taken.

- (e) Any or all bids may be rejected when there are sound documented business reasons in the best interest of the program.
- C. In competitive proposals, proposals are requested from a number of sources and the Request for Proposals is publicized. Negotiations are normally conducted with more than one of the sources submitting offers, and either a fixed price or cost reimbursable type contract is awarded, as appropriate for the use of formal advertising. If the competitive proposals method is used for a procurement under a grant, the following requirements shall apply:
 - 1. The Request for Proposal shall be publicized and identify all evaluation factors and their relative importance. Any response to publicized request for proposals shall be honored to the maximum extent practical.
 - 2. Requests for proposals shall be solicited from an adequate number of qualified sources.
 - 3. The local government shall provide mechanisms for technical evaluation of the proposals received, determinations of responsible offers for the purpose of written or oral discussions, and selection for contract award.
 - 4. Awards will be made to the responsible offerer whose proposal will be most advantageous to the procuring party, with price and other factors considered. Unsuccessful offers will be promptly notified in writing.
 - 5. The City/Agency may utilize competitive negotiation procedures for procurement of architectural/ engineering (A/E) professional services, whereby competitor's qualifications are selected, subject to negotiation of fair and reasonable compensation. The methods, where price is not used as a selection factor, can only be used in the procurement of A/E professional services. It can not be used to procure other types of sources (e.g. administration professional services) even though A/E firms are a potential source to perform the proposed effort.
- D. Noncompetitive proposals are procured through solicitation of a proposal from only one source, or after solicitation of a number of sources, competition is determined inadequate. Noncompetitive proposals may be used only when the award of a contract is not feasible under small purchase, sealed bids (formal advertising), or competitive proposals. Circumstances under which a contract may be awarded by noncompetitive proposals are limited to the following:
 - 1. The item is available from only a single source;
 - 2. After solicitation of a number of sources; competition is determined inadequate;
 - 3. A public urgency or emergency when the urgency for the requirement will not permit a delay incident to competitive solicitation; and
 - 4. The awarding agency (IDED) authorizes non competitive proposals. (Sole source procurement for supplies, equipment, construction, and services valued at \$25,000 or more must have prior approval of the Iowa Department of Economic Development.)
- E. The Local Government will provide, to the greatest extent possible, that contracts be awarded to qualified small and minority firms, women's business enterprises, and labor surplus area firms whenever they are potential sources.
- F. Any other method of procurement must have prior approval from the Iowa Department of Economic Development.

II. Contract Pricing

- A. The cost plus a percentage of cost and percentage of construction cost method of contracting shall not be used.
- B. The Local Government shall perform some form of cost/price analysis for every procurement action, including modifications or change orders.

The Local Government shall maintain records sufficient to detail the significant history of a procurement, including the rationale for the method of procurement, selection of contract type, contractor selection or rejection, and the basis for the contract price.

WHEREAS: The County of Audubon, Iowa

henceforth referred to as the local government, will replace all occupied and vacant occupiable low/moderate-income dwelling units demolished or converted to a use other than low/moderate-income housing in connection with an activity assisted with funds provided under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, in accordance with the requirements described in 24 CFR 570.496(c)(1).

All replacement housing will be provided within three years after the commencement of the demolition or conversion. Before entering into a contract committing the Local Government to provide funds for an activity that will directly result in demolition or conversion, the Local Government will make public by publication in a paper of general circulation and submit to the Iowa Department of Economic Development the following information in writing:

- 1. A description of the proposed activity;
- 2. The exact location on a map (including addresses) and other exact number of dwelling units by size (number of bedrooms) that will be demolished or converted to a use other than low/moderate-income dwelling units as a direct result of the essential activity;
- 3. A time schedule for the commencement and completion of the demolition or conversion;
- 4. The exact location on a map and exact number of dwelling units that will be provided as replacement dwelling units. If such data are not available at the time of the general submission, the Local Government will identify the general location on an area map and the approximate number of dwelling units by size and provide information identifying the specific location and number of dwelling units by size as soon as it is available;
- 5. The source of funding and a time schedule for the provision of replacement dwelling units;
- 6. The basis for concluding that each replacement dwelling unit will remain a low/moderate-income dwelling unit for at least ten (10) years from the date of initial occupancy, and;
- 7. Information demonstrating that any proposed replacement of dwelling units with smaller dwelling units is consistent with the housing needs of low/moderate-income households in the jurisdiction.

Consistent with the goals and objectives of activities assisted under the Act, the Local Government will take the following steps to minimize the displacement of persons from their homes:

- 1. Evaluate housing codes and rehabilitation standards in reinvestment areas to prevent their placing undue financial burden on established owners or tenants of multi-family buildings.
- 2. Establish facilities to house persons who must be relocated temporarily during rehabilitation.
- 3. Adopt policies which protest tenants from developers that would rehabilitate housing in such a manner that it would no longer be affordable to low/moderate-income families or individuals.
