WHEREAS, also pursuant to §331.554(7) of the Code of Iowa, a person may file a claim with the Auditor for the amount of the canceled warrant within five years of the date of cancellation.

AND WHEREAS, upon showing proper proof that the claim is true and unpaid, the Auditor shall issue a warrant drawn upon the fund from which the original warrant was drawn.

BE IT THEREFORE, RESOLVED, by the Audubon County Board of Supervisors that pursuant to §331.554(7) of the Code of Iowa, the above warrants be canceled by the Auditor and correct her records accordingly.

Larry explained that the drill is not as valuable to Audubon County now as it was when it was purchased. He felt that the automated sprayer would be more valuable to spray the trees along the ditches -- he presently uses a hand held sprayer. Crawford County stated they would mount the sprayer on our truck. Larry and the mechanic have looked at the sprayer and feel the sprayer is in good condition. He had checked with the State regarding this exchange and the grant funds used to purchase both items -- the State said the exchange is permissible. The Board wants Larry to compare the cost of the sprayer to the seed drill and report back to the Board.

Larry informed the Board that Crawford County stated that based on the TIGER mower they have, the bigger TIGER mower will not work on the size of tractor that Audubon County has.

Motion-Akers Second-Alt to approve the minutes of the April 15, 1997 board meeting. Vote-all in favor.

Larry returned to the meeting to report that the equipment exchange would be comparable when you figure the cost of Crawford County mounting the sprayer on our truck and that they would also provide a one year guarantee. The Board was all in agreement, if the guarantee is in writing.

The Board reviewed the claims submitted for payment. Motion-Alt Second-Akers to approve the claims against the County and instructed the County Auditor to draw warrants in payment thereof. Voteall in favor.

The meeting was called to order at 9:32 a.m. by Chairperson Deist.

Motion-Alt Second-Akers to approve the agenda and the minutes of the April 24, 1997 board meeting. Vote-all in favor.

Gina Lloyd, Audubon-Carroll-Greene and Guthrie Counties Decategorization Coordinator, updated the Board on the recent community meetings regarding the Decat. Community Plan. Motion-Akers Second-Deist to appoint Sally Alt to the ACGG County Cluster Decat. project. Vote-all in favor.

The Board acknowledged the wage increase of Donald Dean Horning, Conservation Park Maintenance, to \$7.50/hour, effective April 1, 1997, as approved by the Audubon County Conservation Board.

Mayor Clark (Sam) Kauffman and Audubon City Council Members were present to discuss the City's water line utility permit application to be located at 1885 190th Street near Audubon. Discussion was held on the City's policy that will not allow a rural residence access to city water. Mayor Kauffman reported that the Council has rescinded their policy for this property. It was moved by Akers, seconded by Alt to approve the City's utility permit application. Vote-all in favor. Alt noted that she is in favor of the water line utility permit application provided that the resident is not being forced into using city water.

The Council Members and the Mayor then expressed their concerns to the Supervisors and the County Engineer regarding needed improvements to South Division Street. This street improvement is one of the Council's highest priorities. They reported that the South Division Street is being damaged by the heavy equipment and trucks. Poor drainage is what the Supervisors attributed the damage done to the street, not just the heavy trucks and equipment. Other discussion included 1.) reclassifying South Division Street as a Farm to Market Road, in order to use the County's Farm-to-Market funds for the improvements, 2.) other improvements -- water and sewer -- which maybe needed if the street was improved, 3.) Johnson Erickson O'Brien Engineer firm's estimated costs to improve the street and 4.) various funding options -- Grants, Revenue or G.O. Bonding, Special Assessments, & local option sales tax. No action was taken. The Board will ask the County Attorney for her opinion as to whether the County is allowed to assess a special tax to landowners outside City limits to help pay the expenses to improve a street that lies within the City limits.

County Engineer Don Torney reported on various secondary road matters.

Public Health Nurse Peggy Mendenhall reported on the FY 1998 single nursing contract. The grant, in the amount of \$49,034, is for nursing and homemaker/home care aide services. Motion-Alt Second-Akers to authorize the Board of Health to apply for the FY 1998 single nursing grant contract. Vote-all in favor.

The Board reviewed an audit report presentation as prepared by the State Auditor's Office.

The Board approved and the Chairperson signed the Iowa Dept. of Human Services Community Mental Health Center Affiliation and Waiver Request Forms.

Motion-Alt Second-Akers to adopt Ordinance 97-1 as follows:

AUDUBON COUNTY ORDINANCE # 97-1

CLASS "C" ROADS

Title: An Ordinance Establishing the Area Service "C" Road Classification in Audubon County, Iowa.

Section 1. **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this ordinance is to classify certain roads on the area service system in Audubon County as Area Service "C" roads so as to provide for a reduced level of maintenance effort and restricted access, pursuant to Iowa Code Section 309.57 (1997).

Section 2. **DEFINITIONS**

For use in this ordinance, certain terms or words used herein shall be defined as follows:

- A. Board: shall mean the Board of Supervisors of Audubon County.
- B. County: shall mean Audubon County.
- C. County Engineer: shall mean the County Engineer of Audubon County.

Section 3. **HOW ESTABLISHED**

- A. RESOLUTION: Roads may only be classified as Area Service "C" by resolution of the Board upon petition signed by all landowners adjoining the road. The resolution shall specify the level of maintenance effort and the persons who will have access rights to the road. The resolution shall only allow access to the road to the owner, lessee, or person in lawful possession of any adjoining land, or the agent or employee of the owner, lessee, or person in lawful possession, to the agent or employee of any public utility, or to any peace officer, magistrate, or public employee whose duty it is to supervise the use or perform maintenance of the road.
- B. NOTICE OF ACTION: Before the Board may take action on a petition to establish an Area Service "C" road, a notice of the proposed action, including the location of the Area Service "C" road and the time and place of the meeting at which the Board proposes to take action on the petition, shall be published as provided in Iowa Code Section 331.305 (1997).

C. BOARD ACTION: At the meeting, the Board shall receive oral or written objections from any resident or property owner of the county. After all objections have been received and considered, the Board, at that meeting or a date to which it is adjourned, may take action on the petition after consultation with the County Engineer.

Section 4. ACCESS

Access to any Area Service "C" road shall be restricted by means of a gate or other barrier, as determined by the County Engineer. The gate shall be purchased and installed by the County, and maintained by the adjoining landowners. If not so maintained, the County may remove the gate.

Section 5. SIGNS

Area Service "C" roads shall have signs conforming to the Iowa State Sign Manual installed and maintained by the County at all access points to Area Service "C" roads from other public roads, to warn the public they are entering a section of road which has a lesser level of maintenance effort than other public roads, and to warn the public that access is limited.

Section 6. TRESPASS

Entering an Area Service "C" road without justification after being notified or requested to abstain from entering or to remove or vacate the road by any person lawfully allowed access shall be a trespass as defined in Section 716.7 of the Code or Iowa (1997).

Section 7. **RECLASSIFICATION**

A road with an Area Service "C" classification shall retain the classification until such time as a petition for reclassification is submitted to and ruled upon by the Board. The petition shall be signed by one or more adjoining landowners. The Board shall approve or deny the request for reclassification within 60 days of receipt of the petition.

Section 8. **POWERS OF THE BOARD**

All jurisdiction and control over Area Service "C" roads shall rest with the Board, pursuant to the Iowa Code Section 309.67 (1997).

Section 9. **EXEMPTION FROM LIABILITY**

As provided in Iowa Code Section 309.57 (1997), the County and officers, agents and employees of the County are not liable for injury to any person or for damage to any vehicle or equipment which occurs proximately as a result of the maintenance of a road which is Classified as Area Service "C", if the road has been maintained to the level of maintenance effort described in the establishing resolution.

Section 10. **REPEALER**

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 11. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

Board of Supervisors Meeting October 7, 1997 (continued)

If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 12. WHEN EFFECTIVE

The ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

A 50 foot road commencing at a point 33 feet south of the Northwest corner of Section 33, Township 79, Range 35, West of the 5th p.m. (Hamlin Township) and running thence south along west side of said Section 33, Township 79, Range 35 and terminating at the West Quarter corner of said Section 33. The road is further described as being a portion of Ibis Ave. lying south of 270th Street between Section 32 and Section 33 of Hamlin Township; and

- 1. <u>Blading</u>. Blading or dragging will not be performed on a regular basis.
- 2. Snow and Ice Removal. Snow and ice will not be removed nor will the road surface be sanded or salted.
- 3. <u>Signing</u>. Except for load limit posting for bridges, signing shall not be continued or provided. All Area Service "C" roads shall be identified with a sign at all points of access to warn the public of the lower level of maintenance.
- 4. <u>Weeds, Brush and Trees</u>. Mowing or spraying weeds, cutting brush, and tree removal will not be performed. Adequate sight distances will not be maintained.
- 5. <u>Structures</u>. Bridges and culverts may not be maintained to carry legal loads. Upon failure or loss, the replacement structure will be appropriate for the traffic thereon.
- 6. <u>Road Surfacing.</u> There will be no surfacing materials applied to Area Service "C" roads.

- 7. <u>Shoulders</u>. Shoulders will not be maintained.
- 8. <u>Crown</u>. A crown will not be maintained.
- 9. Repairs. There will be no road repairs on a regular basis.
- 10. Uniform Width. Uniform width for the traveled portion of the road will not be maintained.
- 11. Inspections. Regular inspections will not be conducted.
- 12. <u>Gate</u>. The gate shall be purchased and installed by Audubon County, and maintained by the adjoining landowners. If not so maintained, Audubon County may remove the gate; and

WHEREAS, the only persons who will have access rights to the road shall be:

- (1) the owner, lessee, or person in lawful possession of any adjoining land,
- (2) the agent or employee of the owner, lessee or person in lawful possession of any adjoining land,
- (3) any peace officer,
- (4) any magistrate,
- (5) any public employee whose duty it is to supervise the use or perform maintenance of the road,
- (6) any agent or employee of any utility located upon the road.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF AUDUBON COUNTY that this County does hereby establish the road described as an Area Service "C" road, with restricted access and a minimal level of maintenance.

Motion-Alt Second-Akers to authorize the Chairperson to sign the Notice of Termination for the County Farm for the 1998 crop year. Vote-all in favor.

The Board further discussed the libraries' FY 1999 budget allocation request. No action was taken at this time.

Motion-Alt Second-Akers to approve the agenda with the addition of considering Audubon County Compensation Commission realtor/broker members and to approve the minutes of the December 18, 1997 board meeting. Vote-all in favor.

Motion-Akers Second-Alt to approve and sign the Class "C" Liquor License Renewal for Darrell and Marilyn Munch DBA Darrell's Place, effective January 1, 1998. Vote-all in favor.

Lyle Hansen, President of the AID (Audubon Industrial Development) Corporation, reported to the Board that the AID members had voted to pursue merging AID and ACED into one group. They also felt that the board for the new entity should include one member/appointee from the Audubon County Board of Supervisors and one member/appointee from the Audubon City Council. Lyle informed the Supervisors that the Audubon City Council had also voted unanimously in favor of the merger.
