WHEREAS, the lowa Legislature has passed Senate File 453 and presented it to Governor Vilsack, so that unless the Governor vetoes the bill it will become law; and

WHEREAS, Region XII Council of Governments has worked with counties and communities on regionwide housing initiatives for well over a decade, Audubon County is in the Region XII COG planning area and is party to the 28E agreement that governs the COG, and the Region XII COG Executive Board has previously chartered Council of Governments Housing, Inc. (COGH), a non-profit corporation dedicated specifically to the housing needs of the region; and

WHEREAS. COGH is preparing for submission to be recognized for the Region XII COG area as the designated housing trust fund, to be staffed by the COG.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Audubon County Board of Supervisors that:

It designates Council of Governments Housing, Inc. as the official housing trust fund for the county and endorses the efforts of Region XII COG and COGH to establish and operate a local housing trust fund for the region, consisting of Audubon, Carroll, Crawford, Greene, Guthrie, and Sac Counties in Iowa.
