<u>City Insurance-</u> Brandon Toft asked to be considered into the current rotation of Insurance agents for the City's property and casualty insurance.

<u>Water Request-</u> Lance Meaike asked the Council to consider providing City water service to a development north of town. He was asked to provide a summary letter of what all he would be building so the City could contact its engineer for guidance. NO ACTION TAKEN.

<u>Closed session-</u> Hocker moved, Jacobsen seconded, to go into a closed session per Iowa code §21.5 (i) to discuss hiring of a PW Director. ALL AYED. CLOSED SESSION STARTED AT 6:27pm. OPEN SESSION BEGAN AT 7:23pm.

<u>Public Works Director-</u> Griffith moved, Murray seconded, to offer the position to Craig Wanninger. AYES: Griffith, Murray NAYS; Hocker, Hemmingsen, Jacobsen MOTION FAILED 3 to 2. Hocker moved, Murray seconded, to offer the position to Shawn Bohlmann. AYES; Hocker, Murray, Jacobsen, Hemmingsen NAYS; Griffith MOTION PASSED 4 to 1.

Propositions and remarks from the Mayor-none

<u>Propositions and remarks from Council-</u> <u>Hemmingsen-</u> Thank you to the Public Works staff for the new railings in front of the Memorial Building. <u>Griffith-</u> asked who is responsible for the bricks outside the businesses downtown. City Attorney Bosworth stated that both the City and the business would be named in a lawsuit. Griffith mentioned that some businesses are worried about their liability and would like the bricks taken out. Bosworth said that they would need to get permission from the City Council to do that first. It also would not necessarily prevent them from being named anyway.

<u>Griffith-</u> mentioned he sent an email out last Monday asking for information on the applicants for the PW position. The City Clerk and Mayor were the only ones to respond to him. He had hoped members of the Personnel Committee would have communicated, but they didn't. He presented emails from Ed Mahlstadt to the Mayor about complaints of intimidation that were never brought to the attention of the Council. He said that it doesn't feel like all five Council members are communicating effectively. Interviews were set up at times that seemed to exclude him from participation. He asked why each Council member was not contacted to see what would work with their schedules.

<u>Hocker-</u> The whole Council has tremendous respect and support for Craig Wanninger, Despite the previous vote on PW Director.
